

## Ginger Carpetshark, *Parascyllium sparsimaculatum*

### Summary

The Ginger Carpetshark is a largely unknown species, endemic to a very small area in southern Western Australia. This species is recorded from only three specimens and its biology is unknown. Further data are required to assess the species. Due to its limited range and possible small population size this shark may be at risk, although fishing effort is low in the region. At this stage, there is insufficient information to accurately assess its status. Therefore, the species is assessed as Data Deficient (IUCN) and Undefined Stock (SAFS).



### Distribution

The Ginger Carpetshark is only known to occur between Fremantle and Cape Leeuwin off the southern coast of Western Australia (Goto and Last 2002, Last and Stevens 2009).

### Stock structure and status

There is currently no information on population size, structure, or trend for the species.

### Fisheries

There is no information on the interaction of this species with fisheries of any form.

### Habitat and biology

The Ginger Carpetshark has been recorded from the upper continental slope at 204 to 245 m depth. The largest of the three known specimens was 78 cm total length (TL) in size (Goto and Last 2002, Last and Stevens 2009). The biology of the species is unknown.
